Any worker who finds them self the victim of an imposter UI claim can follow the below steps:

- Report the incident to https://identitytheft.gov/ which is managed by the Federal Trade Commission
- Contact his/her local police department and file a report (when possible)
- Report the incident to the state in which the imposter claim was filed using the "Claimant" links below
